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International trade exhibitions in the USA and Italy feature within PetQuip 2013 export programme

Global Pet Expo is the largest pet trade show in North America and draws buyers from the USA, Canada and other parts of the world. British exhibitors in the PetQuip-organised groups at previous Global Pet Expo shows have reported that the level of export orders achieved has exceeded all expectations. PetQuip's director general, Amanda Sizer Barrett believes that next year's show could be equally rewarding: "With the housing market now stabilised, employment situation improving, and growth in the region of two per cent, America appears to be on the mend. While the eurozone remains in the doldrums, America's revival suggests that our members should be looking across the Atlantic to increase overseas sales. Without question there are markets displaying much higher growth rates, but few can match the opportunities in the USA for suppliers in the pet care sectors".

One European market that is seeing remarkable growth in the pet care sector is Italy. To meet this exciting sales opportunity for British firms, PetQuip is to organise a British exhibitor group at Zoomark in Bologna in May. The Italian market for pet products is one of the most dynamic in Europe and continues to expand at a faster rate than those of France, Germany and the UK, and an added bonus for exhibitors is that the show attracts buyers from all over the world.
